3rd PROMESA Conference "Promesa" – What does it mean?

114TH CONGRESS 2D SESSION H.R. 5278

An ACT To establish an Oversight Board to assist the Government of Puerto Rico, including instrumentalities, in managing its public finances, and for other purposes.

This Act may be cited as the

"Puerto Rico Oversight, Management, and Economic Stability Act" or "PROMESA".

3rd PROMESA Conference "Promesa" – What does it mean?

promise <u>noun</u> prom·ise | \ 'prä-məs \ **Definition of** *promise*



1a : a declaration that one will do or refrain from doing something specified
b : a legally binding declaration that gives the person to whom it is made a right to expect or to claim the performance or forbearance of a specified act
2 : reason to expect something little *promise* of relief *especially* : ground for expectation of success, improvement, or excellence shows considerable *promise*3 : something that is promised

What is PROMESA's Biggest Problem/Challenge?

1. To help Puerto Rico restructure its crushing \$72 billiondollar debt.

Pay its debt and at the same time foster economic recovery & development

2. Puerto Rico's Political status:

"Unincorporated US Territory under the powers of Congress"

3. Rebuild the Infrastructure Roads, electric



What is PROMESA's Biggest Problem/Challenge?

4. Decreasing (including productive talent, i.e. physicians are leaving...) and aging Population, insufficient to support economic recovery

3.2 million inhabitants; down from 3.7 million in 2010, net outmigration of 65 thousand annually to the US mainland. Low natality rate; deaths outpace births.

You Get What You Pay For....

Lowest Income per Capita	\$28,703 (PR) vs \$55,836 (US)
Lowest Health Spend per Capita	\$3,500 (PR) vs \$10,000 (US)
Lowest Medicare Funding	43% below US average.
Lowest Medicaid Funding	60% below US average.
\$200M Health Insurance Tax	WITH ZERO BENEFITS.
