Richer data for operators, open and constant lines of communication and a cohesive response have been critical.

Tenet's Incident Command Center has remained the hub of these efforts, allowing for close coordination among all hospitals and facilities. Custom, real-time dashboards have allowed staff to monitor critical metrics, such as PPE supply, medications and ICU availability. This response effort has evolved through various community surges and pivoted to address changing federal, state and local regulations throughout.

Since vaccinations became available, Tenet has set up numerous clinics in its own facilities, while forming partnerships with local churches, schools and area governments to provide additional vaccine sites. Tenet is focused on accessibility, education and bridging cultural disparity gaps to help get shots in arms. Tenet encourages vaccinations for all eligible people to end the pandemic and return to health.
